#### Guidelines

Here are some guidelines we use in order to make our business meeting run effectively and efficiently:

**Ballot results:** Our Local Church Conference has a standing rule that we will only announce the winners of the elections and not the numbers of votes each person on the ballot received, unless this information is needed for a second ballot.

**Nominations:** ALIVE Wesleyan Church uses a Local Board of Administration voted on by the Church Conference. The LBA presents a final nominations ballot to the church conference. However, nominations can be made from the floor, and no seconds are necessary. If the person being nominated is present, he or she can accept or decline nomination. Once nominations from the floor have all been made, the chair will close nominations.

**Staff reports:** The Church Conference will accept all the staff reports after the report of the Senior Pastor. This is done by a recommendation from the floor and a second, followed by voting.

**The Treasurer report:** This report is not voted on by the Church Conference but referred to the Auditing Committee.

Making a motion: To make a motion the following steps are taken:

- Chairman recognizes person desiring to make a motion
- Motion is made
- Motion is supported (seconded) by another member
- Motion is stated by the chair
- The motion is debated by the members
- After any debate, Chair puts the motion to vote
- Chair announces the vote

#### LEADERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

#### Nominations 2016 - 17

All positions of leadership within the church carry certain expectations. Here are a few of the expectations of church leadership:

- Be faithful in your attendance at church services and activities.
- Give regularly of your income with the tithe considered as a minimum.
- Represent the membership of the church in your voting and discussions.
- Lead an exemplary life of Christian faith and conduct.
- Assume a specific area of service within the church.
- Support the majority action of the Local Board of Administration and the Local Church Conference.
- Be a person of faith, believing God can do anything He asks us to do.

#### **SENIOR PASTOR** | Tom Harding

Each year, trying to write a report that summarizes the year becomes more difficult. In fact, before writing my report (by the way, mine was the last one to be turned in) I went through and read all the reports of the other people on staff in order to remember what happened this year. Man, this has been a busy year!

These reports are always easier for me if I find a word to describe the church's condition. In the past I have used words like gratitude, identity and unity as themes for the year. This year I would like to center my remarks around the word pioneer.

#### We have pioneered different roles of leadership.

This year marks year number 12 since me, Lisa and the kids made the move back to Central. When we moved back here, our oldest was 7 and today she has finished her freshman year of college. I think it is safe to say nobody had any idea of what God was going to do in our midst and it's probably good we didn't know! I often think of the passage God used to affirm the decision to head back to Central. Jesus is in Bethsaida and heals a blind man. He spit on the man's eyes and then asked what the man saw.

Mark 8:24–25 (NIV84) <sup>24</sup> He looked up and said, "I see people; they look like trees walking around." <sup>25</sup> Once more Jesus put his hands on the man's eyes. Then his eyes were opened, his sight was restored, and he saw everything clearly.

What a great description of leadership. We step out in faith and follow in obedience. Sometimes we see dimly, and through faith, we will see clearly. This year, at the LBA's prompting, the Church Conference offered me a new opportunity of pastoral commitment by overwhelmingly approving an Extended Call. I was humbled to accept the affirming vote of 96%. This will help position us for future campuses and growth.

We have moved Paul Haithcock into the role of Executive Pastor after serving a year in the Pastor of Administration and Strategic Planning role. We moved him into the role of Executive Pastor because nobody could remember his old title. Just kidding. Paul was brought on for a year with the understanding that we would do 4 separate evaluations over the course of the year to determine if Paul was the right match for ALIVE and if ALIVE was the right match for Paul. It is wonderful to have Paul on board and the church is already benefiting from his abilities and giftings.

We have also added a person in technology, a third resident position, a campus pastor and this year will add someone to help in Children's ministry. On top of all this, four of our staff have produced babies this year. Matt and Anna, Steven and Megan, Paul and Heather, and Patrick and Katie have welcomed or will welcome new additions to the family. The ALIVE staff knows no limits to how we can grow a church.

#### We have pioneered different worship experiences.

As our numbers increased on Sunday mornings, we began to feel the pressure not only in the worship environments, but also ALIVE Kids and the parking lots. This required a change in our worship schedules. So everybody changed. We added a third service in our auditorium and transitioned to a video message in the chapel. These adjustments have temporarily helped to ease some of the over crowding issues. Of course these changes were not easy for any of us but together we have been able to weather the storms of change once again.

ALIVE Kids pioneered a third worship service on Sunday mornings as well as a third offering of Sunday School for the youngest kids. The worship team and tech folks adjusted their schedules and sacrifice to serve a third service on Sunday mornings.

We have pioneered a new campus, adding yet another worship experience. This year we witnessed a history-making moment as the hearts of two congregations were united and we launched a service at Pleasant View. The folks at Pleasant View campus have the heart of ALIVE. We are so honored to partner with the good folks in Belton and to have an ALIVE campus in Belton. We are praying towards the full launch this fall and look forward to seeing the steady stream of freshly redeemed lives pouring into the Pleasant View Campus!

#### We have pioneered new records numerically.

On Easter we had 1912 people in attendance, an all time record high. Our average attendance this year has increased 17% over last year moving from 1120 in average attendance to 1314. Our membership has increased 13% moving from 594 to 671. Our Discovery classes are the largest this church has ever seen which indicates not just an approval of what is happening here, but a desire to be a part. ALIVE Kids has moved from an average attendance of 218 to an average attendance of 247 this year. In our discipleship groups this spring we had the highest group ever enrolled in small groups with almost 450 people, an increase of 89 people over spring of 2015. And our income has increased 20% this year moving from \$1,463,357 to \$1,761,036. The upward trend in giving is significant in many ways. People are willing to give to what they believe in but also more and more people are committing to the Biblical model of tithing and God is blessing that in the lives of this community.

It is obvious to people with spiritually discerning hearts that God is moving in the ALIVE community. He is giving us a season of harvest and our obedience to him continues to be at the forefront of what happens at ALIVE.

#### We have pioneered new events this year.

We added a Christmas Eve Service this year and an additional Easter Service. We had a Glow Hunt with record number of kids in attendance as well as Jingle Jam. Night to Shine was one of the most amazing events of our church year as we cared for part of our community that so often is neglected or over looked. Through Night to Shine we had over 600 folks come to share love and smiles to people with Special needs.

#### What do we pioneer next?

Well that's a great question. The immediate areas of need are children and parking. We continue to reach capacity on Sunday mornings in our children's areas. Our Growing Place ministry has a significant waiting list. Our parking team continues to look for creative ways to park people in the grass and around the building. As we head into the next year, these two items are at the top of our list to address.

I am grateful for this church and for the people here who understand the value of faith in a community of believers. It is an honor to lead such a vibrant body of believers with such a deeply committed LBA and staff.

Once again, the Hardings feel deeply blessed to be part of this body and to serve as your Pastoral family. Be assured of our deep love and admiration for ALIVE. We thank you for your prayers as we lead and for the deep, sincere support we feel.

#### **EXECUTIVE PASTOR** | Paul Haithcock

It was just over one year ago that I had the honor of joining the ALIVE staff. To say we have experienced some change along the way would be an understatement, but I firmly believe each decision has been a response of obedience to what ALIVE leadership has sensed God calling us to. God has been calling us to initiate fresh and new ways to reach the spiritually hungry in our community with the good news of Jesus Christ.

When we look back at what has happened over the past year – it is evident that God's mercy and grace has been our source of guidance and provision. In addition to an increase in attendance and financial giving this year (see below), God prompted the hearts of many families and individuals in our church to demonstrate their commitment to reaching the spiritually hungry people in our community by jumping into a volunteer role at ALIVE. In November over 500 people showed up at the All Hands on Deck volunteer event. We were able to celebrate our volunteers and cast vision for what was coming next. Over 270 individuals who came to the event were looking for a place to serve.

God is expanding our impact in ways we never would have predicted. He continues to provide opportunities for us to tell the stories of what He has done and is doing at ALIVE. In September our church was given the honor of hosting the Wesley Seminary Board and providing them not only with meeting space, but also an inside look at who we are as a church. We were honored to tell this incredible group of leaders the mission and methods we believe God has called us to. In November a group of pastors from the Shenandoah District of the Wesleyan Church toured our facility and spent an afternoon interacting with staff. It is not uncommon for ministry leaders to stop by to ask questions about how God is working through the people of ALIVE.

It is because of your overwhelming commitment to the 96,000 that we were able to implement multiple new strategies this year. In January, every ALIVE attendee adjusted to a new service schedule; the chapel attendees transitioned to a video sermon experience, and our staff lead us through the process of enhancing our volunteer systems to launch a third service in the auditorium. We sensed immediate synergy from these changes and just when we thought things were going to level out, along came Pleasant View.

On Easter Sunday of this year, we officially soft launched our first off-site campus, ALIVE, Pleasant View. Working with the core group from Pleasant View Wesleyan Church has been an amazing show of how the Church should function – loosely holding onto anything but the Great Commandment and the Great Commission. This group of people, joined by a group of ALIVE, Central pioneers and Pastor Kehl are already creating a stir in the Williamston/Belton community. And we believe God is going to bless this effort as they reach their community for Jesus.

Reflecting on what God has accomplished through the leadership and laity of ALIVE is so humbling and reminds me again how necessary it is to maintain a deep dependence on God's direction and leading.

Thank you for the honor of serving alongside you in ministry and being a part of this movement of God as we continue to reach spiritually hungry people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Heather, Jackson, Bennett and I are blessed to be loved and supported by such an authentic community as the ALIVE family.

#### WORSHIP PASTOR | Patrick Dagenhart

I am grateful for the privilege to bring another annual report to you as ALIVE Wesleyan's Worship Pastor. This past year has been one of massive change for our church, including the areas in which I lead. Through it all, I am thankful for God's faithful hand that guides us and empowers us for His ministry.

Change began quickly last summer in the area of technology. First, we hired our first ever Technical Director, Matt Heerschap, to lead and oversee our worship technology. Matt has done an outstanding job of bringing creativity and steady improvement in our technology at ALIVE, as well as pouring countless hours into our faithful and talented tech volunteers. Matt's incredible talent in video production is a special gift to our church and is a major tool we use in reaching the 96,000. Matt has done all of this while also being a full-time Media Communications student at SWU!

We also began the process last summer of completely overhauling our website, alivewesleyan.com, to become "mobile-friendly" in our age of smart phones and iPads. As I oversaw this overhaul, I was amazed at the ability of our staff to learn, grow, and self-teach many aspects of our new website. Statistics tell us that most people will visit our website before ever visiting our church, a compelling reason to make sure it is inviting, helpful, and easy to use.

After the website launch, I was able to release some of my web technology responsibilities to other staff. Tracy Roach took on the oversight of our new website and has done an excellent job in making it look good and function well. Hannah Covington has taken on leadership of ALIVE Wesleyan's social media sites, including Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram. In each case, our web technology continues to improve, expand, and become more influential in our church and community.

The last half of this year has been a blur, with the addition of a fourth worship service in January through the use of video venue technology in the Chapel, and the soft launch of the Pleasant View Campus in March. ALIVE now provides 5 worship opportunities every weekend on two campuses! Our Technical Director Matt Heerschap and our worship technology volunteers have tackled the learning curve of multi-venue worship and have served with commitment and excellence. Our Traditional Worship Service participants have embraced the video sermon format, with many saying they can hear and see Pastor Tom better than ever! Our Contemporary Worship volunteers have embraced another service and an extended schedule on Sundays. Heather Haithcock and Amber Collins have also stepped up to provide leadership in the areas of music and technology at the new campus. They are living out what it means to be a pioneer as they blaze a new path of ALIVE worship ministry in Belton, SC. In all of these different ways, ALIVE Wesleyan worship continues to grow and embrace these changes in order to better reach the spiritually hungry. To God be the glory!

I cannot express fully my appreciation and respect for our Worship Leaders, Jeremy Palomo and Tabby Hughey. More than colleagues, they are truly my brothers in the Lord. This appreciation extends to all of our worship volunteers as well, who give so much of their time and talent every week to see the 96,000 come to know Jesus! Sunday is always coming, and our volunteers are always there to meet it. Katie, Marlee, and I continue to feel so blessed to be part of this special community.

### **DISCIPLESHIP PASTOR** | Justine Tegen

As we reach the end of this conference year, I am in awe of how God has moved at ALIVE in 2015 and 16. We have seen Him move in our groups. We have seen Him move through our sermon series. We have seen God raise up new leaders, deepen commitments, and open new opportunities as only He can. And as I think back on all that has happened in one year, I can only stand in awe.

This past year we watched God move through our small groups. In the last two semesters we saw record numbers of individuals joining groups. Spring 2016 marked our highest group sign-ups ever with 445 distinct individuals joining groups, up 89 from the same time last year. It's worth celebrating not only numerical growth but also spiritual growth and connection.

One family jumped into a group this past fall and found freedom from unhealthy habits. Their lives were so changed that their elementary-aged child told them "our family is different." Another individual new to faith shared that the night of groups is "the best night of the week. I just love being with other people like this." The stories go on from groups providing Christmas and birthday gifts to nursing home residents, to groups taking meals to hurting families, to parents sharing the joys and challenges of adoption and foster care. These stories make me stand in awe of our God who shows up.

We've also seen God move through our sermon series this year. For the first time ever we kicked off both fall and spring semesters with a church wide series. In the fall children, youth, and adults followed along with Freeway, and God worked through that study. Families had honest conversations in their homes and learned about their kids' doubts and fears, and teens made written commitments to live in freedom. At one point during Freeway, individuals were coming to staff members sharing how God was convicting them and expressing a desire to change. We watched in awe as God's Spirit counseled and convicted.

We watched God move in the lives of individuals who found and took their next steps. For some that meant stepping into leadership or joining a group, and for others that meant baptism. This year we celebrated baptism with over 20 adults and teens. We also celebrated growth in our Stephen Ministry. Under the faithful leadership of Martha Warden, this care ministry for people in crisis trained 7 new leaders. The new leaders were commissioned in February and are now a part of the 13-member team that is mobilized to provide one-on-one support to those facing challenges at ALIVE.

As I've seen God move through spiritual and numerical growth at ALIVE, I am continually amazed at how He keeps raising up new leaders and opening up new opportunities. This fall our discipleship team is preparing to train leaders and launch our groups at Pleasant View. I am also looking forward to launching ALIVE University in Fall 2016. This teaching ministry will compliment our small groups system and provide another layer of instruction and discipleship.

As I look back at all that God has done over this past year, I cannot help but get excited about the year to come. God is definitely moving at ALIVE, and my prayer is that this year we will continue to move, continue to grow, and continue to stand in awe of Him.

#### **CONNECTIONS** | Beth Petersen

It is an honor to conclude another year serving ALIVE Wesleyan as Assistant to the Senior Pastor as well as to step into different ministry areas. As I reflect on a year packed with transitions and incredible growth I am continually in awe of the men, women, students and kids who bring the vision of ALIVE to life. I absolutely love getting to serve alongside individuals who have called ALIVE Wesleyan their home church for 50 years and some for only few months.

Serving alongside our Guest Services teams I have watched them embody the Andy Stanley quote, "the sermon begins in the parking lot." Every Sunday teams of parkers, greeters, hosts, Orange Room staff, and coffee bar volunteers serve with an awareness of that truth. These teams know that spiritually hungry people will drive onto our campuses and that our actions craft their first impression of the ALIVE Wesleyan community and even the God we serve.

This past year over 160 Guest Services volunteers demonstrated their love for spiritually hungry people as they embraced changes with enthusiasm and grace. Our teams welcomed over 50 new volunteers, altered our process for engaging guests, made changes to our coffee systems and changed our serving schedule to accommodate a fourth service. At the end of September we launched the Orange Room, a dedicated space, which allows individuals to take a next step to connect at ALIVE. Volunteers welcomed over 100 people to the Orange Room looking for information about where youth meets, what we have for kids, how to find a group or place to serve, looking for spiritual help or wanting to know what defines a Wesleyan. This space gave individuals a clear next step for connection to ALIVE, and we continue to look at ways we can improve this system.

With the launch of the ALIVE Pleasant View Campus our leadership team began the work of replicating systems and applying them to a new context. It has been a joy to see teams of new volunteers welcoming guests at our Pleasant View campus. We are grateful to have Gracie Hudson providing leadership for these newly formed Guest Services teams at ALIVE Pleasant View. Her genuine love for people and for building teams is an asset to ALIVE.

In August God allowed us to have a resounding impact in our community when ALIVE was invited by the Tim Tebow Foundation to host an adult prom for adults with special needs called A Night To Shine. Five months of planning and 400 volunteers were needed to create an event where almost 200 guests were told they are created and loved by God. Again, ALIVE volunteers lived out our mission as they had a blast doing hair and make up, preparing food, acting as buddies, parking cars, serving parents and caregivers, and working alongside volunteers from our community, many of whom represented the 96,000. After a training night at ALIVE, one volunteer asked if he should serve if he wasn't religious? He was told YES! At Night to Shine we also discovered there are a lot of ALIVE people who can dance! Thank you to the incredible planning team and volunteers that made this night a success.

I am grateful for the individuals I do ministry alongside—for incredible volunteers who make ALIVE happen each week, for the leadership teams who are the backbone of our ministries, for the opportunity to work with Hannah Covington one of our 2 year residents and for the dedication with which she has served. I am blessed to do ministry everyday with a leader and coworkers who love Jesus and His church. I am grateful for His presence and transformational power that allow us to be a community of believers reaching spiritually hungry people and introducing them to a personal relationship with Jesus and an active role in Christian Community!!

### PASTOR OF CONGREGATIONAL CARE | Fred Andrews

What a special privilege it is for me to present my annual report as I conclude 39 years of service to this church. My job is exactly what the title implies: I am the staff member who offers pastoral care to members of the congregation.

During this year, each staff member was given the assignment by Pastor Tom to determine the three crucial tasks that we do in our ministry. These tasks were described by the question: "What do I bring that the church couldn't hire someone else to bring?" This assignment became a liberating experience for me as I made that determination. Not only was it liberating, it was also affirming to solidify what is crucial for me in serving the Lord in this church. So here is what I describe as my crucial tasks:

- Provide a ministry of presence to people of all ages, especially during times of crisis.
- Through my ongoing ministry to senior adults, lead them to own the mission of ALIVE and support the fulfilling of that mission through fervent prayer.
- Serve as a mentor to staff members both by their invitation as well as by my own initiative.

In recent months I have endeavored to focus more intently on ministering with the aid of these crucial tasks. For example, as I have continued to offer a ministry of presence in times of crisis, I have begun to form a team of persons to assist me in carrying out that responsibility. Given the rapid rate of growth that ALIVE has experienced in recent years, I am intentionally preparing for the times when the need for ministry during a crisis depends upon many people who are prepared for that occasion.

One of the pleasant surprises of my ministry has been the opportunity to serve several staff members as a mentor in a structured manner. Initially the reason for the need was simply that of meeting a requirement in a graduate ministry program. As the months have passed, the results seem to confirm the value of my involvement in the lives and ministry of my younger colleagues. I am praying for God to work through me in this very fulfilling opportunity for ministry.

What a joy I experience as I continue to serve the Lord in this church I dearly love. I remain grateful to the Lord for His call upon my life and that I am able to fulfill that call in this church. To God be the glory!

#### STUDENT MINISTRIES PASTOR | Matt Irvine

AWSM has lofty goals for our students. We're setting out to raise up mature, committed disciples of Jesus, whose time with AWSM builds upon the growth they experienced in ALIVE Kids, and delivers them into adulthood prepared to continue impacting the world for Jesus! We believe teens are best prepared when they've learned to Own their Faith, Own ALIVE as their Church, and Own the mission Christ has given His people.

Own their Faith - Some highlights of teens owning their faith begin with ALIVE's Fall "Freeway" series. God used this series in a mighty way! During the last night of this series our students were asked to write on a board the things God had freed them from in the past weeks, and what He had invited them into. The list is a powerful testimony! Students were freed from: anxiety, fear, depression, anger, jealousy, pornography, hatred, pride, judgmental attitudes. Students found: compassion, patience, boldness, trust. Praise the Lord for changing young lives, from the inside out! Students also owned their faith in our newly formed "Huddle" groups. These groups take place on Wednesday nights, in response to the worship and message of our big group time. They offer new students a chance to connect immediately. These groups have become a place of authentic community. Students also made new commitments and experienced life-change at Follow2015, the International Wesleyan Youth Convention (where 5 students who went with us accepted Christ for the first time). Additionally, we celebrate with eight of our students and volunteers who were baptized in the last year.

**Own the Church -** Our students learned to Own ALIVE in many ways this year. They continue to serve in large numbers, in almost every area of the church. Nine of our students participated in Discovery classes to become members. Some of our students took up the challenge of helping launch our newest campus, becoming some of the first pioneers for ALIVE Pleasant View! As we seek to deliver students into adulthood, helping them understand that ALIVE is their church is vital to their continued growth; serving, giving, and deepening their commitment to ALIVE is crucial to that goal.

**Own the Mission -** It is my firm belief that doing ministry "to students, through students" is one of the best ways to help students grow, and help reach the 96,000. We have to help our students understand that 10,000 of that total are their own age. In the last year, on Wednesdays, we've gotten to know over 100 of those students for the first time, seeing about 40 of them become more regular attenders! Many of these students have made ALIVE their home, and a quarter of them have transitioned all the way to attending Small Groups with their peers on Sunday nights! The summer of 2016 saw ALIVE's first ever indoor Nerf War, as well as our third year of Amplify, where we served our community non-profits, schools, and Clemson Downs. During Amplify our students also served at VBS, allowing them to personally get to know and lead some of the 96,000 to Jesus! One of the most exciting ways students are owning the mission is taking place in their homes, schools, teams, and workplaces. Everywhere you look, students are leading and serving in their areas of influence. We've even seen a handful of students called to ministry, missions, or a specific vocation.

It has also been my pleasure to work with our three residents for another year. Our weekly teaching time has been extremely powerful, and our residents continue to impact ALIVE in every area they serve. It's a privilege to be part of a church raising up the next wave of practically trained and gifted leaders!

#### CHILDREN'S PASTOR | Stephanie Rhyne

It has been an incredible year in ALIVE Kids! What a year of growth, milestone attendance, a new campus launch, system changes, and packed outreach events! I love hearing stories of families who are making ALIVE their home and are finding a place to come ALIVE. What God is doing here continues to amaze me!

In November, we began talking about launching another service at ALIVE. Not only were our adult services full, but our kids' numbers were increasing weekly. We needed to find a way to increase the capacity of our kids' area, and strategically change systems to accommodate growth. To give you a picture of our attendance growth, the following chart is the average attendance trends over the past five years:

Praise the Lord! In January, a 3<sup>rd</sup> service was added in our K-5<sup>th</sup> grade environment as wells as additional teaching in preschool during all service times. Since the new service launch, we have averaged 303 in ALIVE Kids with our highest attendance ever on Easter Sunday at 383! In less than a year, we increased on average close to 40 new preschoolers in preschool ministry! God continues to amaze me!

We also began implementing our new capacity system, which helps monitor the safe number of children in each classroom during services. Base Camp, an option for kids who attend more than one service, was restructured and moved to the youth room to also allow for growth. ALIVE Kids is moving forward quickly and we are blessed to have the opportunity to reach so many children each week!

They even have a crawl tunnel across the top of the hallway with a slide into the kids' room! We are so excited about what God has planned for this place and for the kids who will be a part of it.

As we think ahead, we continue to plan for more growth and find ways to make ALIVE Kids the best hour of a child's week! One of our goals for this year is to be strategic in the use of space and allow for more growth at TGP. We will be transitioning our afterschool space to a preschool environment, which will reach even more families in our community. We look forward to seeing the families that will come as a result of this change and can't wait to care for more preschoolers and their families.

God has blessed us with 11 full-time and 5 part-time teachers. These teachers have a passion for children and love what they do. They also have a true understanding of the mission of our church. Each teacher completes 15 hours of continuing education courses each year and all of our teachers are First Aid/CPR certified. This year we were able to have in-house training that focused on the needs of our center. In the upcoming year, we plan to add several substitute teachers, one full-time and one part-time teacher as we grow in each age group.

This is our third year of having Camp ALIVE. Camp ALIVE is a fun camp experience where kids learn all about the God who is crazy about them and have tons of fun playing crazy games, swimming, playing sports, going on field trips, and much more. It is also another opportunity to reach children and families from our community.

#### **OPERATIONS PASTOR** | Pete Wood

Once again it is an honor to prepare an annual report for the people of ALIVE. It is especially exciting to think of all those who are new to ALIVE reading this and other reports for the first time.

As the Operations Pastor, my primary responsibilities involve caring for the day to day operations of the ALIVE campuses. This includes making sure that the facilities and grounds of ALIVE are attractive, comfortable and safe every time people attend an event on any of our campuses.

The facilities of ALIVE are a very busy place, not only on Sundays, but also throughout the week. Each day over 115 parents drop off and pick up kids at The Growing Place Childcare Center. This year, over 2,750 hours of childcare has been provided through the center with no serious injuries to report. In any given week, there are between 30 and 55 events taking place on in ALIVE facilities. Some of these are worship services, small group meetings, rehearsals, team meetings, and weddings or other special events. In the past 12 months, that's a total of 2,100 events, up from 1,500 last year. When you consider the number of people and vehicles coming and going on Sunday mornings, the Parking and Safety Teams deserve a "job well done" for their work.

The new Pleasant View campus in Belton is currently undergoing a facelift to give it an ALIVE feel. New paint and flooring have been installed throughout, a new rock exterior, new signage, new walls going up in the Kid's area, the addition of a coffee room, and major updating of the auditorium are a few of the changes taking place there as we prepare for a late summer launch. There is even a tunnel and a slide entrance being installed for the kids to use as they enter the Kids area. It has been so exciting to watch the folks of Pleasant welcome these changes and get involved with doing whatever it takes to reach their community with the message of the Gospel.

Working behind the scenes in a support role with the staff of ALIVE continues to be a very rewarding part of this job. It is encouraging to see this staff use their abilities and talents to face each new challenge with the everpresent mission of reaching the 96,000, and it's an honor to be a part of this group. I am thankful for each of them. Their dedication to do whatever needs to be done to continue moving forward is amazing. God has assembled a wonderful team here at ALIVE who enjoy working and doing life together.

The 2 responsibilities I enjoy the most each year are organizing the Discovery Classes and working with a great group of volunteers. The stories of people who attend the Discovery Classes are so affirming to hear. They serve as a constant reminder of why it is so important for ALIVE to stay on mission and purpose as we grow. 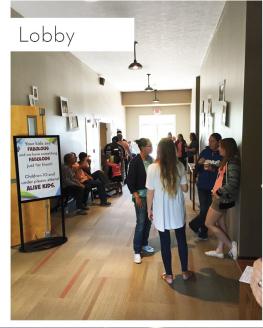

The financial activity for the past year demonstrates God's work through our faith, commitment and the generosity of those that call ALIVE Wesleyan Church their home.

Financial Measures for this past year are highlighted:

- Received \$1,571,867 in Tithes and Offerings, an increase over \$270,000 or a 20.7% increase in the past year exceeding this year's budget by 3.28%
- Continued growth in The Growing Place resulted in an increase in support of ALIVE ministries.
- Our commitment to 96,000 Reach enabled ALIVE Wesleyan to invest in the Pleasant View campus and to expand ALIVE ministries to the Belton and the Williamston areas.
- Paid additional loan payments of \$272,000. With the additional payments of over the past three years, we will save over \$960,000 in interest over the original payment schedule of 25 years. We have now reduced the original term of the loan by 9 years and 6 months.
- Generous contributions above allowed us to support the Stop Hunger Now project.
- A special thanks to the leadership from the Finance team, the tellers who contribute their time behind the scenes weekly, and Christin Harrison and Paul Haithcock for their support.

God continues to be faithful and resource ALIVE Wesleyan Church with people and financial resources. Let's us continue to be faithful to our call as we reach the 96,000.
